

WHO WILL BE ABLE TO SEE PERSONAL DATA ABOUT ME IF I AGREE TO RECEIVE SOCIAL PRESCRIPTION SERVICES?

REFERRAL AGENT

This is the person who is referring you to receive social prescription services. (They might be your GP or another professional healthcare worker who you have met). They will use any information they receive from the Community Provider to assess how well the social prescription is working.




REFERRAL HANDLER

(They might be a social worker, housing officer or a different healthcare professional engaged by the organisation providing the social prescription services to you.)
They will use the information they get from the Referral Agent to contact you. The purpose of the meeting will be to see if they can find a programme/ service for you to attend which might help you to feel better.



ELEMENTAL

The Community Provider may **record whether or not you attended the event**. They may also take **notes on the progress you are making**. The Community Provider may share that information with the Referral Agent and Referral Handler.



COMMUNITY PROVIDER

(This will be someone who is responsible for running an event – perhaps classes at **your local gym** or a **course about something that interests you**.) They will use this information to book you into the event. They may also want to **contact you directly in relation to the booking or the event**.



If you and the Referral Handler find a suitable programme/ service and you agree that you would like to attend, **the Referral Handler will send over information about you to the person who runs the programme/ service**. This might include your name and contact details and (if you've agreed that they can) details about how you are feeling and any information relevant to the referral.

This graph is only intended to **give you an idea** of how your data will be treated if you agree to take part in a social prescription programme. It **doesn't include all uses** of your data. Each person who receives your data will have their **own privacy policy** and make their **own decisions** about how they use your data. If you have any concerns about how data relating to you will be used, you should **ask your Referral Agent (for example GP, Social Worker or Housing Officer)**.
