Youth Provision

Resurgam Youth Initiative were delighted to open their new 3D Youth Centre in February, centralising delivery of youth provision in Resurgam's target communities.

Resurgam Youth Initiative delivers contracts through Service Level Agreements for Education Authority Northern Ireland (EANI). Resurgam Youth Initiative delivers programmes within Department for Education's 'Priorities for Youth' Policy Framework to improve outcomes for young people, supported by:

- (i) Early Intervention Lisburn a CYPSP Locality Planning Group tasked with improving outcomes for children and young people aged 0-18 years and includes targeting young people's educational improvement within schools
- (ii) Resurgam's Healthy Living Centre which coordinates young people's health and wellbeing
- (iii) Lisburn SAFE Steering Group, linking Community Safety partners to target young people at
- (iv) EANI Local Advisory Groups (Priorities for Youth) informing delivery of Centre Based and Outreach provision
